






Race/Ethnicity: 7 Responses

We may benefit from hearing from classmates/colleagues as opposed to listening, too often, to lectures and reading from the assigned textbooks. It was fascinating to learn that most of the professors in the counseling program were/are lacking the most important skill in counseling: listening. It's unfortunate that we did not have the experience that many other universities provide. Counseling is really about hearing someone else, having a genuine concern for him/her, and about creating a safe environment for him/her so he/she is both willing and encouraged to explore underlying issues. The professors teaching us were not able to model this, nor were they welcoming much feedback and knowledge from their graduate students. I can read the textbooks myself and I'm sure I can create my own powerpoints and lecture a class. However, I cannot mimic the rare and unique expereince one gains from being in a classroom where we are feeling free to speak, share, cry, and educate each other. This is what counseling is about. This, however, is not what we received (with the exception of one professor). It's truly a shame. I don't/won't recommend FGCU's counseling program to anyone.	A
