Current Research

Pilot Study - Teacher Training in the Principles of Behavior Analysis: *How does training in principles of behavior analysis and positive behavior support affect teacher handling of discipline issues?* This is a pilot study of teacher training in the use of principles of behavior analysis to address problematic student behaviors. Two groups of teachers will be provided comprehensive 3-day training on classroom management. One of those groups will also receive training in the use of behavior analysis to develop positive interventions and supports for students. Pre and post data will be collected on teacher self-efficacy in classroom management. Survey data will be collected on teacher perception of training and data will be collected on teacher attrition. Results will be analyzed.

Pilot Study - Sight-Word Approach to Reading: *Is the Edmark Reading Program effective for teaching students with disabilities who have not learned to read through traditional phonetic approaches?* This is a pilot study of an individualized intensive intervention (iii) for reading that does not use a phonetic approach, but rather uses a sight-word approach to teaching reading. Two groups of students are receiving 15 minutes of individualized instruction daily for a period of 8 weeks. Group A receives a traditional phonetic intervention while Group B receives a sight-word intervention. Pre and posttests in reading recognition and fluency are being administered and results will be analyzed.
